Three games for three wins

Now I am not a greedy man, so I love it when we do a clean sweep, because you just can't ask for more.

In the NSW Cup we won 34-12 over the **Newcastle Knights**, in the Holden Cup it was 34-22, and of course, in the big game, **Simon Mannering's** boys came home with a flourish to win it 38-18.

It was our second three-peat in a row, after the NSW Cup triumphed 36-22 over the **North Sydney Bears**, the Holden Cup team won 20-16 over the **Titans**, and NRL side recorded that great 24-16 win on the Gold Coast the week before.

I could get used to this!

Super Simon has a milestone belter

What can you say about **Simon Mannering** that hasn't already been said. In his 100th match as captain and his 200th game for the club he was simply outstanding.

He became only the second player to appear in 200 NRL matches for the club - the other being the **Little General Stacey Jones** - and the first to reach 100 games as captain.

Not bad for a young man who is still only 27.

Current and former team-mates, **Kiwis** internationals and rivals including England international **Sam Burgess** showed their respect for Mannering with video messages, as did our old mate **Micheal Luck**. The **All Blacks**, **Valerie Adams** and **Joseph Parker** also sent messages of congratulations.

As a captain, after his game at the weekend, his record was 53 wins and 47 losses. He's also chipped in with 47 tries, averages about 28 tackles a game, and 90 metres or so.

There is so much more to come since he recently re-signed to the end of the 2018, which will extend his career to 14 seasons, a record for a **Vodafone Warrior**.

And consider this. In his first year back in 2005 he was used seven times before establishing himself in 2006. Since then he has missed only 14 of a possible 206 games, seven in 2010 with a hamstring injury and another five late in 2012 with an ankle complaint. Outside that, he's missed only one game in 2009 and one last year. And remember, he almost always plays the full 80. Amazing.

What a day and what a crowd

I was delighted with the more than 19,000 crowd at Mt Smart at the weekend. It would have been nice to sell the place out, but I will take 19,000.

It is so important that we get good crowds at our "spiritual" home, because with plenty of complaints about Eden Park, the Auckland Council and the powers that be at the club have to see bums on seats, which prove fans will support the team at Mt Smart.

And there was so much to cheer. **Simon Mannering** got a first half double, his first almost all his own work, while Feleti Mateo's lovely pass played a key role in his second right on halftime.

Sure we let Newcastle within four points early in the second half, but we dug in and second half tries to **Chad Townsend**, **Konrad Hurrell**, and a second for **Manu Vatuvei** gave us so much to smile about.

It was our sixth win of the season - giving us a six win-six loss record at the halfway stage of the campaign.

Was it not wonderful to see the NYC and NSW Cup teams form a guard of honour for Mannering?

I loved seeing **Sam Tomkins** get a try on his first ever outing on Mt Smart too, and I will never tire of seeing Manu Vatuvei's giant grin when he goes over - and he does go over often. He has scored nine this year and 126 in his career.

When Mannering completed his double right on halftime I thought it was good reward for the dominance we had shown. But Newcastle, to their credit, really put in a good shift at the opening of the second half to get it back to 22-18.

It is not often you are left gasping at a try-saving tackle, but when **Darius Boyd** lowered **David Fusitua** I couldn't ever recall seeing a better effort from a defender.

But we stayed patient, and the rewards came. **Ngani Laumape** siezed on a loose ball and flicked it to **Chad Townsend**, who crossed for his first try for the club, like Tomkins, in his first Mt Smart outing.

I knew it was in the bag then, but we iced the cake, which is so important, keeping the pressure on. **Konrad Hurrell** crossed for his 29th try in his 46th game, and at the death I got to see that Vatuvei grin again.

Bunnies up next

The **Vodafone Warriors** now prepare for their most challenging away game of the season, to take on the Bunnies after a hell of a flight all the way to Perth. They will train there on Thursday and Friday and then take on the **Rabbitohs** on Saturday. It will be a long night for the fans, with the game kicking off at 11.30pm our time.

Eddie Kohlhasse: New Zealand Order of Merit

Softball great, Eddie Kohlhasse has been honored for his over 30 years of service to New Zealand softball.

The former **Black Sox** player and coach has become a member of the **New Zealand Order of Merit**, having being named in the Queen's Birthday Honours list last weekend.

Kohlhasse says the coaching side of his career is what he is most proud of. "I think you can influence people through sport. With playing you're focused on yourself and your own performance but the coach has to take the whole organisation into consideration and you're really at the top of the tree in terms of leading.

As a player Kohlhasse first joined the **Black Sox** in 1983, being part of the winning world championships team in 1984 and placing second in 1988 and 1992. Injury forced his retirement in 1995 and he was appointed assistant coach of the Black Sox in 1998. The New Zealand team won the world champs in 1996, 200 and Christchurch in 2004 after which he was appointed coach of the **Black Sox** in 2004.

In 2013 after the **Black Sox** again won the world championship, Kohlhasse becoming the first New Zealander to win world championships as a player and a coach.

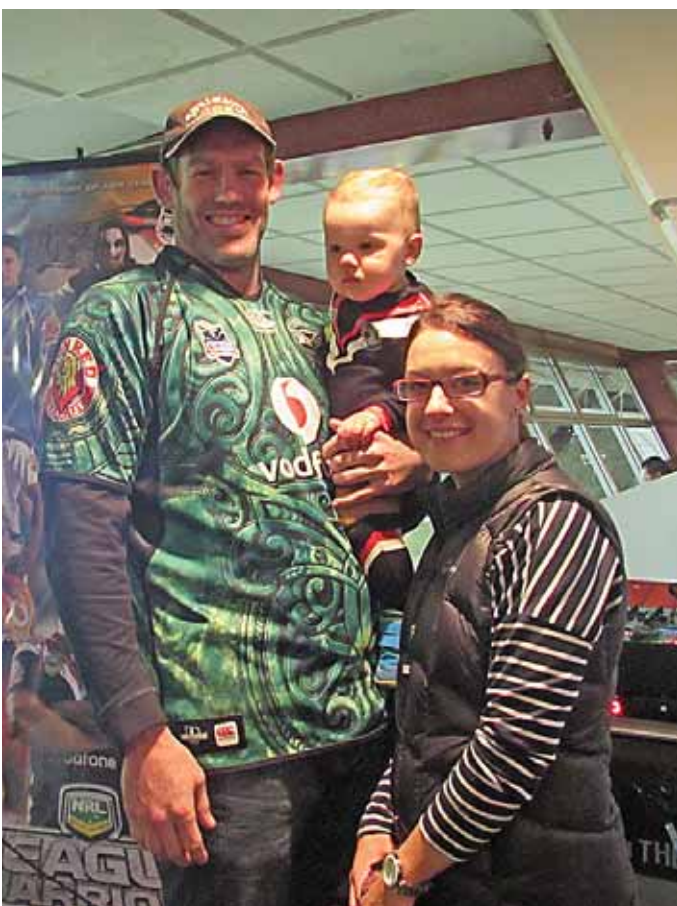

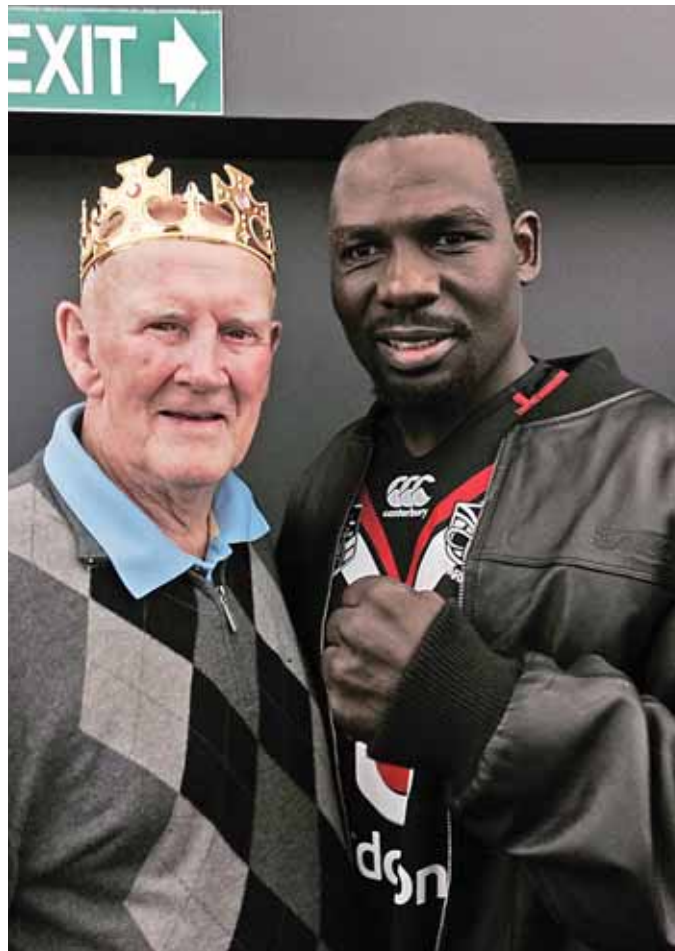

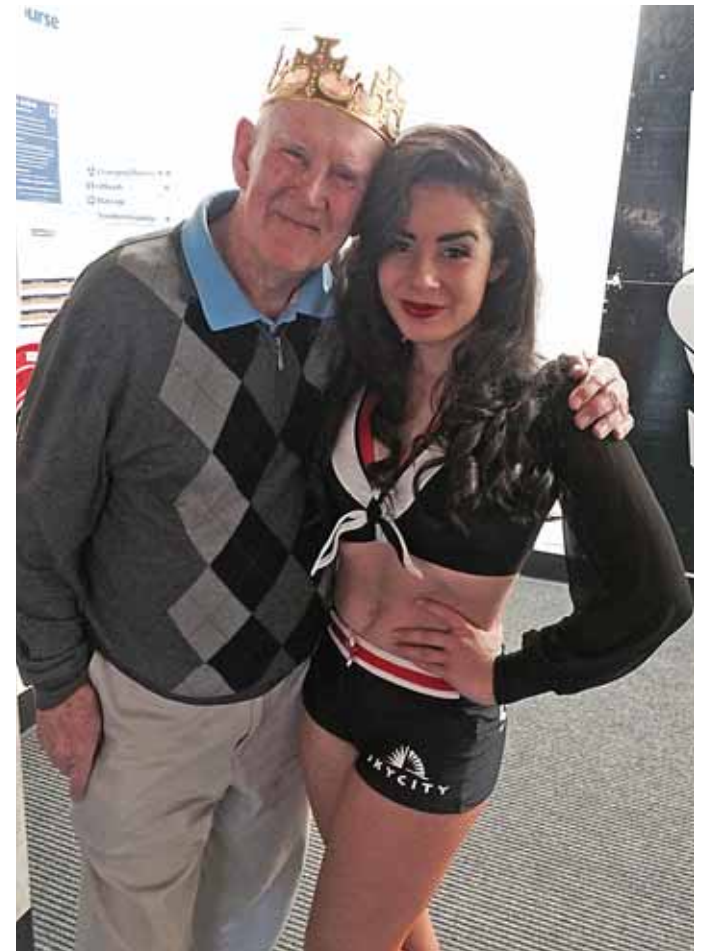

They had some of rugby's royalty present. **Sir Brian Lochore** - who led the **All Blacks** to 15 wins in 18 tests during his five seasons as captain, then went on to coach the first **All Black** team to win the Rugby World Cup in 1987 - was there. And what a top bloke he is.

Eric Rush, who has an amazing record in rugby as an **All Black** and who is regarded as our best ever **Sevens** player, captaining the Commonwealth Games gold medals, in 1998 and 2002, was there guest speaker, and he was as funny as any after-dinner speaker I have ever heard. He had the audience in fits of laughter.

And he did it despite a guy at the function taking a bad turn as he was speaking, and a local hitting a power pole and plunging the place into darkness.

Rushy just rocked on - outstanding. He is so funny and you also never hear him swear, which is just gold.

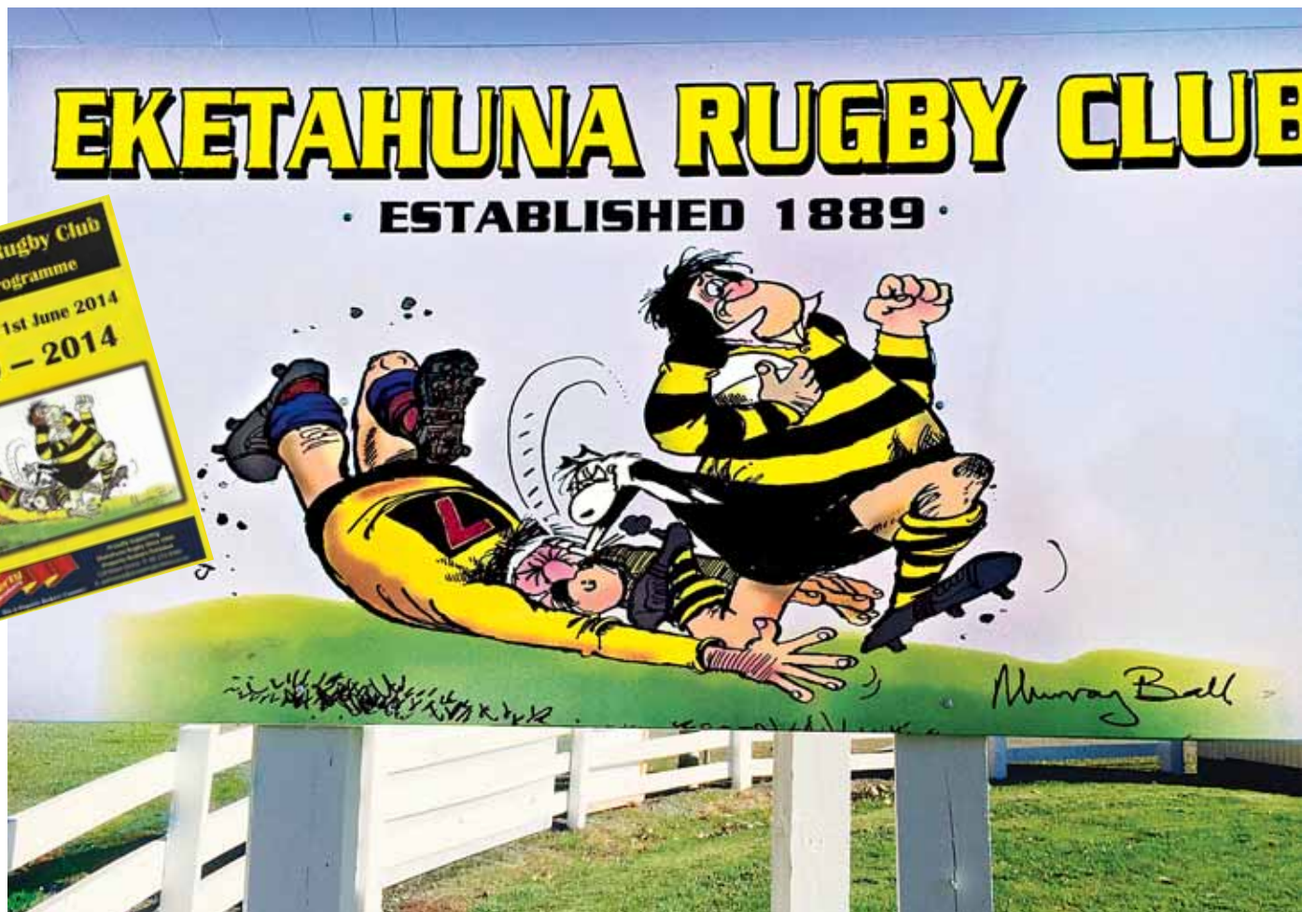

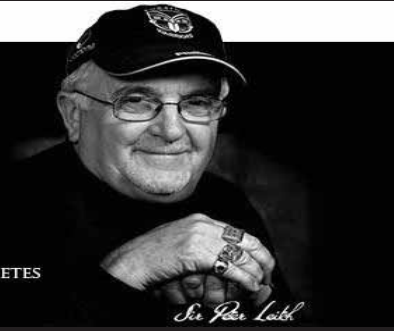
