NRL ROUND #20 – LAUMAPE AND RAPIRA RETURN

Auckland, New Zealand, July 22, 2014

odafone Warriors head coach Andrew McFadden has made two squad changes for Sunday's blockbuster 20th-round NRL clash against the competition-leading **Manly Sea Eagles** at Mount Smart Stadium (4.00pm kick-off; match day sponsor: Suzuki).

After serving a three-game suspension, **Ngani Laumape** (21) returns on the right wing for his 24th NRL appearance while 163-game veteran prop Sam Rapira is brought onto an extended bench.

Laumape comes in for 19-year-old David Fusitu'a while Rapira, who has missed the last two matches with a back problem, comes onto a five-man interchange for Agnatius Paasi. He joins Feleti Mateo, Ben Matulino, Thomas Leuluai and Jayson Bukuya, who was 18th man for last Saturday's 22-28 loss to Brisbane.

The **Sea Eagles**, beaten grand finalists last year, took outright ownership of the competition lead on 28 points with their 21-12 win over **St George Illawarra** last night.

The only regular season meeting between the seventh-placed Vodafone Warriors

watering match-ups.

"It's exciting for us as a club, for our members and for our fans to have the Sea Eagles here at this time of the season," said McFadden.

"They've been the form team in the competition and bring so much quality with them. It's a massive challenge for us and a great opportunity to see where we measure up.

"There were aspects of our performance which were disappointing last weekend. In the first half much of the detail which has been good for us wasn't at the level we expect."

The head-to-head comparisons in the two starting line-ups are endless.

At fullback it's **Sam Tomkins** against **Brett** Stewart, on one flank Laumape takes on fellow Tongan powerhouse Jorge Taufua and Manly offers a smorgasbord of mouth- while on the other wing Manu Vatuvei has Anthony Watmough, Jamie Buhrer

clashes with rookie Kiwi international and former Vodafone Junior Warrior Peta Hiku. In the centres it's Konrad Hurrell v Steve Matai on one side and defensive specialist Dane Nielsen marking the vastly-experienced Jamie Lyon on the other.

The halves pit Kiwi Shaun Johnson and Chad Townsend against another Kiwi in Kieran Foran as well as Queensland Origin halfback Daly Cherry-Evans.

At hooker one Queenslander Nathan Friend squares off with another in Matt Ballin while Vodafone Warriors' props Jacob Lillyman and Suaia Matagi are set to collide with Brenton Lawrence and Josh Starling.

In the back row the Vodafone Warriors have Simon Mannering, Ben Henry and Sebastine Ikahihifo while Manly and Tom Symonds.

The Sea Eagles have been one of the Vodafone Warriors' most difficult opponents with just eight wins in 25 encounters and only two victories in the last 12 games.

The last time the two sides had a Mount Smart Stadium contest in June last year the Vodafone Warriors won a thriller 18-16, ending a run of six straight losses to Manly stretching back to the 26-24 success at Brookvale Oval when Stacey Jones made his comeback in 2009.

Sunday's programme again features a tripleheader with the fifth-placed Vodafone Warriors taking on Manly in the New South Wales Cup at 11.40am followed by the NYC encounter between the two clubs at 1.45pm.

hat a great night Lady Janice and I had at the Mt Eden Bowls Club last week when they launched the book written by my old mate Phil Gifford (Loosehead Len) called "Loose Amongst The Legends". Book launches can be pretty dry shows, but this one had it all, good friends, some big names from the media and sport, and some terrific music from Phil's mates, the great Midge Marsden, and a brilliant guitar player, Chet O'Connell, Kevin Chapman from the publishers spoke really well, and Phil told us how the book was a chance to use all the great stories he's only shared with friends and family until now. It was a real fun night, with legends from sport like lan Jones, BeeGee Williams, Joe Stanley and Roy Williams swapping yarns with media heavyweights Simon Dallow, Duncan Johnstone, Donna Chisholm and Trevor McKewen. If you want to get the inside story on some of our greatest Kiwis, from Sir Peter Snell to Billy T James, from Sir John Kirwan to Valerie Adams, from Todd Blackadder to Joe Stanley, then this is the book for you. Phil also tells us how Loosehead Len came about in 1973, and how Loosehead gave him the chance to work in radio, to travel the world, and even to meet Sir Edmund Hillary. There's also a chapter on The Butcher, and the time Phil and I had a guy trying to send to hospital in a demolition derby at Waikeraka Park. I've been really impressed with this book, which has top stories, a swag of laughs, and some brilliant photos, which come up really well on the high quality glossy paper they've used throughout thoughout. 

Thanks for your help in promoting the **Broncos v Warriors** game. It was a fantastic atmosphere – sounded like more **Warriors** supporters in attendance than **Broncos** and we raised plenty of money for the **Rise For Alex** fund. We doubled the number of wristbands compared to any other game and they all sold out by 6.30pm. People were happy to purchase lots of wristbands and make donations on top of the wristband purchase.

\$37,082 was raised from the \$1 per attendee donation and at least another \$15,000 was raised from the sale of wristbands. So far across the game we've raised more than \$1M to assist with Alex's rehabilitation and recovery. A cheque will be presented to Alex later this week. Its always amazing to see the people who dig deep to make donations – many of those who were making donations had bought their own food to games and were sitting in the cheapest seats – 95% of these people were wearing Rise for Alex wristbands – many of them more than 1 wristband.
