conversions.

It was a full-on team effort with **Manu Vatuvei** scoring three tries and Sam Rapira two. I will never tire of seeing big Manu's smile when he goes over, so to see him bag a hat-trick was special.

Manu had been having a lean spell by his amazing standards, one try in his six previous games, but he got his three tries in quarter of an hour.

The *Raiders* only scored their three converted tries in the last eight minutes when *Vodafone Warriors* coach **Andrew McFadden** decided to rest all our injured players, with **Konrad Hurrell** (hamstring), **Sam Tomkins** (hip), **Jacob Lillyman** (ankle), **Thomas Leuluai** (groin) all being taken out of the game. That meant for the last 10 minutes we played with only 12 players.

But I could not help but think how pitiful Canberra were, and how sad that is for the game. The glamour clubs seem to go from strength to strength, and signing superstars seems to be no object, but clubs like Canberra struggle. Call me old-fashioned, but I want to see genuine contests, and Sunday's game was anything but. The win certainly did our points for and against total no harm, and with Cronulla coming to Mt Smart this weekend, the boys will come into it on a high.

The win puts the Warriors back in the top eight, and

earlier in the day our Holden Cup team, coached by club legend **Stacey Jones**, thrashed the **Raiders** 54-6, with **Sam Lisone** having a very strong game.

Nines dates set

The **Dick Smith NRL Auckland Nines** will be back at Eden Park in 2015 on January 31 and February 1.

All 16 NRL teams will enter the tournament, which carries prizemoney of more than \$A2.4 million. The size of each squad has been increased from 16 to 18, enabling teams to rotate more players and provide them with longer rest periods.

The teams will be split into four groups and play nine minute halves.

The top two teams from each group advance to the

knockout stage of the tournament, with the two top teams playing in the final.

The inaugural tournament this year, won by the **Cowboys**, was played in front of a crowd of nearly 90,000. NRL spokesman **Paul Kind** said the **Nines** is a fun and spectacular way of playing league. Hard to argue against that.

"The atmosphere this year was absolutely brilliant and saw thousands of Australians travel to New Zealand for the event's first year," he said. "Not only does it produce great football but it brings enormous economic benefits to New Zealand."

Auckland Mayor, **Len Brown**, said the *Nines* provided outstanding entertainment for league fans and superb economic returns for Auckland. "Event organisers will once again transform Eden Park into a league playground, and the *Nines* is set to become a special event in Auckland's major events landscape."

Duco Events director **David Higgins** is already urging fans to put their names on the **Ticketek** waiting list to secure seats.






And caught up with my old mate Kelvin who had us out to his place for lunch.
