



Talk about hard-fought. If it was meant to be a cakewalk against the **Sharks**, no one told the bottom-placed side, because they hung on like a dog with a bone and the **Vodafone Warriors** only scrapped home 16-12 at Mt Smart on Sunday.

It was an odd kind of atmosphere, with 14,000 fans in, but **Mannering** and **Ben Henry**, going into the centres. they were strangely quiet, perhaps because they were struggling with what they saw.

But credit where it is due, the **Sharks** were amazing on defence, and I can't remember how many times they pulled off try-saving tackles. That meant the **Warriors** failed to score a point in the second half, which contributed to the grumblings.

But if I have to take winning ugly, I'll do so. The Sharks have beaten us in our last five outings, and are a bit of a bogey team. If you don't believe me, just ask Matt Elliott, our last coach, who lost his job after we went down 37-6 to them in the first half of the season.

And you have to be able to take the positives. **Ngani** Laumapae was outstanding, bagging a double, and Manu Vatuvei had one of his best games in a while. He did a lot of work, and still managed to bag a try - number 14 for the year.

This week we have the Newcastle Knights at Hunter Stadium, and it has banana-skin written all over it. We should win, with the Knights well below us on the table, but they have plenty to play for, and are fresh off one of the greatest Houdini acts of all time on Saturday, scoring

Hooter heartbreak

Wests Tigers scored the match-winning try after the siren to hand the **Vodafone Warriors** a 28-22 loss in the New South Wales Cup clash in Sydney.

Bashed 42-4 the week before by the **Mounties**, it could not have been crueller, especially after leading 22-6 lead early in the second half.

But the *Tigers* fashioned a comeback and tied it all up at 22-22 and a draw looked inevitable until a centre **Jy**

Hitchcox scored the match-winning try after the full-time siren had sounded.

Having started in sixth, we slipped a place to seventh, one point ahead of eighth-placed Cronulla and only two ahead of Newtown, now ninth.

"Tommy" signs on

Thomas Leuluai has extended his contract to the end of the 2017 season. While he wasn't off contract until the

end of next year his manager, **Peter Brown**, has worked with the **Warriors** to secure a two-year extension, which will stretch his second stint with us to five seasons.

Leuluai said it was important to settle his long-term future. "While I've had a frustrating season I couldn't be happier being back home," he said. "I always wanted to come back to not only play in the NRL but to play for my original club."

Mate, and we could not be happier to have you!

Sunday's clash against the *Sharks* was Leuluai's fourth since returning from a three-month lay-off after issues with the groin complaint that ruined his 2013 Rugby League World Cup campaign.

He played every minute of the *Vodafone Warriors*' 24 games last year – 1,920 in total – in what was an impressive return.

TEAM ANNOUNCEMENT

There are several line-up changes for Sunday's game against the *Knights* at Hunter Stadium in Newcastle (4pm NZT).

Shaun Johnson returns for his 80th NRL appearance after missing three games with a groin injury, and there are two other backline changes – both forced by injury - with **Dane Nielsen** (concussion) and **Tuimoala Lolohea** (hamstring) out.

Konrad Hurrell is still unavailable so **Ben Henry** comes into the starting line-up and **David Fusitu'a** returns on the right wing.

There are also four changes to the starting pack. **Thomas Leuluai** comes in at hooker and **Nathan Friend** goes to the bench. **Jayson Bukuya** and **Ben Matulino** make up the second row and **Simon Mannering** switches to loose forward.

Shaun was close last week but coach **Andrew McFadden** didn't want to risk him, and fair enough

He says the changes are all about trying to lift our performance because he felt it wasn't what it should be against the **Sharks**.

The **Knights** have had two outstanding victories in their last two homes games beating the **Roosters** 16-12 and the **Storm** 32-30.

And big **Ben Matulino** plays his 149th NRL match on Sunday, leaving him in line to play his 150th when the **Vodafone Warriors** host the **Roosters** on August 24.


