

> Rohan Smith's team avenged two regular season losses to oust the fifth-placed Mounties and will meet Illawarra, who finished the season in fourth, but were smashed 42-6 by minor premiers Penrith.

Rams' historic win one of Dawson's best moments

Coaching the **Southland Rams** to a win against **Canterbury Development** has given **Greg Dawson** one of his best moments in rugby league.

He and Southland District Rugby League chairwoman **Cheryl Officer** were beaming after the **Rams** won 30-20 at Rugby Park in Invercargill on Saturday.

It was a historic result for the *Rams*, who have shown plenty of improvement in recent seasons. It now has them eyeing a potential home final in the South Island competition. "That was memorable . . . to see the boys do that against Canterbury," Dawson said.

Officer believed from talking to senior Southland league officials, Saturday's win was the first time the province had beaten Canterbury.

Josh Gough was the *Rams* player of the day. The second of his two tries had the crowd rocking as he sped down the terrace touchline to score in the last few minutes. He intercepted a loose pass and took off.

"Josh came off his line many times to shut them down," Dawson said.

Captain **Chee Turuwhenua** ended the game with thumb and leg injuries. "The body took a few knocks but it was worth it," he said.

Dawson said Turuwhenua had experience and outstanding leadership qualities. "The whole team showed plenty of heart [on Saturday]. It was our defence that won us the game . . . at times, we put ourselves under pressure by making errors."

The opportunity to play at Rugby Park was a feel-good factor for the *Rams*, Dawson said.

Changing rooms at Rugby Park are superior to the facilities used by league players most weeks at Sandy Point and Elles Road (Invercargill) playing fields.

Kiwi Ferns become family affair

Three sisters and two of a kind sounds like a great poker hand, and it may also hold the key to Kiwi **Ferns** hopes of toppling archrivals, Australia, in their one-off test later this year.

National women's rugby league coach Rusty Matua has named 10 newcomers in his 18-strong line-up for the World Cup final rematch on November 9, uniting two sets of siblings at international level for the first time.

Hooker Hilda Peters joins younger sisters Rona and Kahurangi on the roster, while twins Sharnita Woodman and Kiwis Ferns rookie Shontelle Dudley will suit up in black together for the first time.

"I think it's quite cool to have that family flavour to our team and it's something we've tried to bring into our culture moving forward," admits Matua, after last weekend's selection camp in Rotorua.

He was assistant coach when the three-time champion Ferns lost their grip on the World Cup last year, but feels "excited" about the prospects of rebuilding towards the

Ray 'Rabbits' Warren is the legendary voice of Australian sports commentary. People tell him he must have drunk a bottle of scotch and smoked a packet of cigarettes every day to have the voice that he has. That's not the case - at least, not anymore ...

The son of a railway worker, Ray placed his first bet on a horse called Playboy at the age of just six, and won. A lifelong love of the track - and the punt - was born.

During his remarkable broadcasting career, which has now spanned almost five decades, Ray has called three Melbourne Cups, Commonwealth and Olympic Games swimming, and countless rugby league matches alongside his mates Fatty, Sterlo and Gus.


Here, for the first time, Ray reveals the man behind the microphone. He speaks of the great highs and devastating lows of his career and life in the same way he calls every sporting event: with great passion, colour and candour.

RAY WARREN is one of the most experienced sports broadcasters in Australia. The son of a railway worker,

he began calling racing and rugby league in country NSW in 1966, and worked for several radio stations and Channel Ten before joining the Nine Network in 1989. In addition to being the doyen of rugby league commentators, he is 'the voice of the pool' and has broadcast Commonwealth and Olympic Games swimming, most recently at London 2012.

ANDREW WEBSTER is Chief Sports Writer for The Sydney Morning Herald. He has written about sport - particularly rugby league - for more than 17 years at a range of publications. He has covered Kangaroo tours, summer and winter Olympic Games, and the FIFA World Cup. He also appears regularly on Channel Nine. He has written and contributed to several books, including the widely acclaimed Supercoach: The Life and Times of Jack Gibson.
