Raelene did six years as head of Kiwi netball and is still on the board of the international federation. She became the first woman NRL CEO when she joined the Doggies.

Former Chairman Recognised

There was further good news for league, with former NZRL chairman Scott Carter made a Member of the New Zealand Order of Merit. He stepped down last year, but certainly made his mark on the game.

He grew up in the King Country and later went to Auckland Grammar, going on to serve in the police, and later to set up the Matrix Security Group. In 2009 he was appointed NZRL chairman by Sparc, after a review of league in New Zealand.



While a few old heads grumbled, there can be no doubt he knew what he was doing, as evidenced in 2011 when he was appointed chairman of the Rugby League International Federation, the first Kiwi to hold the role.

A GONG FOR A GOOD GUY

The Christchurch newspaper headline said it all. The awarding of a Queen's Service Medal to former Kiwis halfback Gary Clarke in the New Year Honours was fittingly lauded with the words "Good Guy Gets A Gong".

Gary fashioned an outstanding record as a player, captain-coach, non-playing coach and selector over three decades but has remained active in rugby league as a sponsor and avid collector of memorabilia.

His QSM was awarded for services to sport and philanthropy, having also been a generous patron of many varied charities, not to mention a willing host to numerous functions at his plastics factory.

From a strong rugby league family, Gary was a Schoolboy Kiwi on his way to earning senior international honours against the 1966 Great Britain tourists and at the 1968 World Cup tournament in Australia and New Zealand.

He played through an era of outstanding inside backs in Canterbury, with Bob Irvine and Graeme Cooksley also wearing the Kiwis jersey. Gary made 30 appearances for the province from 1963 to 1971 and captained South Island against the 1969 Kangaroos.

After retiring from representative football, Gary was player-coach of the Papanui teams which won the 1971 and 1972 Canterbury championships. He later coached Sydenham to reach the 1978 club grand final. Gary was a Canterbury selector for 10 years from 1974. In 1975 he coached the first Canterbury team to beat Auckland at Carlaw Park. His 1983-84 term as a New Zealand selector included a Test win over Australia and a three-Test whitewash of Great Britain.

That would have been enough for most people to put their feet up and reflect on the glory days, especially when one also had a business to run. But not Gary Clarke.



For years his collection of rugby league memorabilia attracted rugby league and general sports fans to his former factory near Lancaster Park. They could only gaze at it in awe.

To put it in perspective, his collection even rivalled that of Sir Peter Leitch, with whom he developed a close relationship in helping to record the game's history and recognise former players.

When the Christchurch earthquakes struck in 2010 and 2011 the factory and neighbouring buildings were damaged beyond repair. The stressful search for a new facility took a long time but Gary has now re-established his business, and his rugby league collection.

While rugby league folk might have been aware of Gary's sponsorships of the game at provincial and club levels, and through the South Island Kiwis Association, they probably knew nothing of the generosity he has shown to charity organisations.

His QSM citations listed Camp Quality, Heart Children New Zealand, the Ricki Herbert Football Academy, Autism New Zealand, St John, Child Cancer Foundation, Governors Bay Pre-School, Cholmondley Home, and the Bromley Kids First Kindergarten. All have greatly benefited from Gary's patronage.

"It's one of those things, there are a lot of good people out there," he modestly told The Star. "I never thought what I have done over the years (for the community) would be recognised. But, hey, I'm proud."

He particularly enjoyed how grateful children were when they received something, no matter how small it might be. "I get a lot of enjoyment out of that, especially when I get the thank you letters. I'd have enough to wallpaper half a dozen rooms. I've kept them all and framed them all but haven't found room for them yet."

Gary Clarke recently underwent hip replacement surgery. The sidestep might not be quite as sharp as in the past but he can still handle the stairs at his new factory and the welcoming smile is as genuine as ever. Yes, this good guy really deserved his gong.
