# Anzac Day Test Vodafone Warriors vs Gold Coast Titans

YES I will talk about the Vodafone Warriors, after all, this is our newsletter, but what I really want to focus on is the Kiwis this Friday at Suncorp.

#### Strong Kiwis Side Named

Four players have forced their way back into Kiwis contention for this week's Test in Brisbane, after missing last year's Four Nations.

Coach Stephen Kearney has named his 18 players to prepare for the traditional one-off encounter at Suncorp, with Roger Tuivasa-Sheck, Dallin Watene-Zelzniak, Ben Matulino and Sam Moa returning.

Tuivasa-Sheck was unavailable for the end-of-season internationals, but has hit top form in his new role as Sydney Roosters fullback.

Watene-Zelezniak was named to make his Kiwis debut on the wing in the Four Nations opener, but broke a bone in his foot during the team's build-up.

A variety of injuries kept Matulino out of the Kiwis programme last year, while Moa withdrew from Four Nations consideration due to family illness.

**Kearney Ready For The Challenge** 

Kiwis coach Stephen Kearney took the time to talk to us exclusively about the test. And say what you like, when the Kiwis coach can give us his time, that shows the character of the man.

He told us his planning had gone well, but of course he was staring at the NRL round and hoping to get all the players he wants through unscathed.

That was not to be, with Jason Taumalolo, the Kiwis lock ruled out of the Anzac Test in Brisbane after suffering a serious knee injury in the Cowboys' 26-24 win over the Knights.

Taumalolo suffered a medial ligament injury after taking just the second hit-up of the game. He's likely to be sidelined for between six to eight weeks.

"Last year we were staring down the barrel of selecting a team with 16 players unavailable, but this year there are a lot of guys in form and we have plenty to pick from," Kearney said.

"A third of the year is out of the way, and while it is always a blow to lose anyone to injury, it is just something you have to be aware of and plan for.

"The weekend's round of the NRL

gave us another chance to have a look at a few players, and that's an important opportunity to fine tune our thinking.

"Whatever happens, one thing we do know is that Australia will be very wary of us. They have always said they don't take us lightly, but we are standing on the brink of making it three in a row and they will not want that to happen," Kearney said.

He said preparation remained the key.

"From our perspective we have to get together and prepare well, and beyond that we must go out and perform to the levels I know these boys are capable of. If we can do that we will give ourselves opportunities, but make no mistake, it is a huge challenge facing a wounded Kangaroos side."

"Having said that, the players are entitled to take confidence from what we achieved at the Four Nations, so if we play to our strengths, put our hands up and take ownership and responsibility, we could achieve something historic.

"This team is capable of a job for us this week and it's also an opportunity to take another step towards our ultimate goal – the 2017 World Cup."

#### Ferns Get A New Captain

After 15 years and four World Cup finals, veteran half Laura Mariu will finally get a chance to captain the Kiwi Ferns, when they line up for the Anzac curtainraiser at Suncorp next Friday.

Mariu, 34, has inherited the job from fullback Sarina Fiso, who hasn't recovered from a knee injury suffered at the Nines in February.

"It was quite overwhelming to be told I was captain, but it's an awesome opportunity, and an honour and a privilege," she says. "In terms of leadership, I guess I've always played a role because of the position I play, but captaincy is not something that's ever come my way."

Mariu has been a mainstay of the national side for more than a decade and is actually a double international, having represented New Zealand for five years as a softball outfielder.

### Watene-Zelezniak May Miss Out Again

Penrith star Dallin Watene-Zelezniak is set to be denied a Kiwis debut for a second time.

Less than a day after being selected to play Australia, the 19-yearold was charged by the NRL match review committee with a grade one dangerous throw.

Even with an early guilty plea, Watene-Zelezniak faces a one-match suspension due to points from previous offences, meaning he'd have to beat the charge to make his debut.

But early indications from Penrith are that the club will accept the one-match sanction.

Watene-Zelezniak has until noon on Tuesday to enter a plea, and will face the judiciary on Wednesday night if he opts to fight the charge.

The Panthers say the decision will be theirs alone.

Watene-Zelezniak was set for an international debut in last year's Four Nations against Australia but fractured a foot and missed the whole series.

The Kiwis have called in Jason Nightingale and he'll play should Watene-Zelezniak miss out.

#### McFadden Slams Team

"We are just leaking too many points and when you leak easy points the opposition feel that and that's what happens. Hopefully we get through the rep round unscathed, but we're going to have to bounce back. We've got two away games next (Sharks and Eels) so it's going to be a critical period."

And it was worse in the Herald on Sunday, which described 20 minutes of madness where tackles were missed, the Titans were waved through and the Warriors' energy levels dropped as quickly as their heads.

The paper described what happened as "carnage" and pointed out what most of us realise – that we have conceded the most points in the competition.

#### Doyle Warns We Won't Be Pushed Out

Great to have Vodafone Warriors chairman Bill Wavish in the lounge on Saturday, and he did not hold back, firing big time at the councillors involved in the bid to force the Vodafone Warriors out of Mt Smart and over to Albany.

Wavish said fans would not go over the bridge. "Our fans won't go there, it's as simple as that. Some of it is physical, the traffic is difficult, it's a long way. But some of it is mental, just crossing the bridge is like going overseas."

And he was joined by our CEO Jim Doyle, who said the Warriors would fight to the bitter end.

The council is just days away from a vote that could force us to Albany, but Jim said the club had a watertight lease until 2018 and was not going anywhere.

He urged us all to play a part by lobbying councillors, something I am right behind.

"It's time all league people stood up and let the council know how they feel," he said. "I love Mt Smart. No one in Auckland would like the idea of home games being played outside the city."

The plan will see a major shakeup of the city's stadiums:

- Mt Smart will become a speedway venue.
- Western Springs will be turned into a cricket arena - for one test a year.
- QBE Stadium will be upgraded, including a roof.
- We will have to go to Albany, with some matches at Eden Park
- Eden Park remains the home

of Auckland Rugby and Cricket.

"This plan is official, but we won't give up," Jim said. "We are talking with all the councillors because we think there is a better solution. There is no logical sense in kicking the Warriors out when we have the greatest economic impact of any sports team in the city. But the message is that Auckland doesn't care about league."

# New Annual Trans-Tasman Event Confirmed for the Black Sticks

HOCKEY New Zealand and Hockey Australia have put aside their traditional on-field rivalry to launch a new annual contest that will pitch all four national teams into a battle of true trans-Tasman pride.

New Zealand's Black Sticks Men and Women and Australia's Kookaburras and Hockeyroos will take centre stage in the annual event following the signing of the four-year agreement, the first of its kind between the two countries.



Although the exact competition format is still to be confirmed, it's proposed the four national teams will battle it out for one trophy, with the first event to take place next year.

Hockey New Zealand chief executive Malcolm Harris believes the event will build on the national pride and rivalry that exists between the two countries.

"We expect that this new annual contest will be a real step forward for the sport in terms of engaging fans and raising the profile of hockey on both sides of the Tasman," said Harris.

Hockey Australia chief executive Cam Vale says the agreement is important for the future growth of hockey in both countries.

"We have the chance to develop something from scratch with entertainment and the fan experience at the heart, creating a new, big event," says Vale.

"Sport and sports fans love the Australia-New Zealand rivalry and the rivalry in hockey is one of the closest there is. On any given day either country can come out on top."

Both countries will work together on innovations with broadcasters, sponsors and fans to ensure it becomes a key event in New Zealand and Australia's sporting calendar.

It has been agreed that next year's inaugural event will be in New Zealand, with Australia set to host in 2017. Host venues will be announced in due course.

# **4 Day Countdown to 2015 ANZAC Test Match**

THIS weekend Rugby League history will be made when New Zealand plays Australia as part of the Anzac Test Match in Brisbane. This special match will commemorate the 100th anniversary of the ANZAC landings at Gallipoli.

In true spirit of the Anzac the Kiwis and Kangaroos will come together on the field as a key game in rugby league's program of events. The Test is the only international match between the Kangaroos and the Kiwis in 2015.

Sir Peter Leitch, NZRL Patron has been in Brisbane last week promoting the upcoming test.

"I think We've lost 16 Anzac tests in a row but if ever we were going to win one this is the one we want to win. We're celebrating 100 years of the Anzac, it's very very special. I know I'm very emotional about it and I'm doing everything I can to get as much Kiwi support to drive our boys home. We want to fill Suncorp stadium up with Kiwis – it's possibly the biggest weekend of Rugby League this year," he says.

New Zealand Kiwis player Alex Glenn has been ruled out of the game due to injury, but he had these words to say about next weekend's challenge.

"It's always a big game. As a proud Kiwi we always look forward to it. Australia have a great team and they always play well. I know it's not going to be easy but the boys can take a lot of confidence from the way they finished the Four Nations last year," he says.

New Zealanders still have time to make it across the ditch to cheer on the Kiwis in the game which will be held at Brisbane's Suncorp Stadium.

"If you can get over her to Brisbane, get over here! I don't care if you swim, or get your Kayak out. Get over here and show your support for our boys, the Rugby League boys," says Sir Peter Leitch.

May 1st also sees the Australian Jillaroos take on the NZ Kiwi Ferns at Suncorp Stadium, while Pacific powerhouses Samoa, Fiji, Tonga and Papua New Guinea will be part of a triple-header at Gold Coast's Cbus Super Stadium on Saturday May 2nd. The first match on Saturday night will feature the Junior Kangaroos against the Junior Kiwis. The PNG Kumuls will then take on Fiji Bati, before Samoa return to the international stage following their successful Four Nations campaign against traditional rivals Tonga.





# The Best Email to Auckland Councillors Re: Mt Smart

OT a copy of this email sent out to every Auckland Councillor. Robert, the sender, wins dinner and friend from me for the best letter so far:

Dear Councillor, I am writing to you perhaps as a lone voice, but one I feel would be echoed by many tens of thousand Aucklanders if they had the opportunity to be heard. I am a devoted Warriors fan, and a 20 year season ticket holder, but I am also a proud Aucklander who cares about my city. I take keen interest in the people elected by my fellow Aucklanders to run the city, and in the decisions they are entrusted to make in the best interests of our home.

I feel that the forthcoming vote that will be undertaken by you, in regard to the proposed RFA Plan, has the potential to be a calamitous disaster, if you don't have the courage and common sense, to vote NO to the proposed plan, and give your recently appointed RFA Chief Executive, an opportunity to take stock and re-examine the entire spectrum of issues that effect Auckland Stadia.

Auckland has made so many such mistakes in the past, but this potentially expensive and incredibly ill-thought proposal, must be halted, before irreparable damage becomes the consequence. Our city had the possibly once in a generation opportunity, to accept a primarily government funded National Stadium on our waterfront prior to the RWC 2011. Instead we responded by petty infighting and indecision by our elected officials, who not only rejected this amazing opportunity for our city, but instead decided to invest tens of millions on the financial Bermuda Triangle that is Eden Park. With that tragic error in our recent past, I implore you to realise that two wrongs do not equal a right, and spending more millions on Albany is insane. That stadium has never been, and will never be, of value to Auckland City. A new roof will not fix this stadium's appalling location, horrendous transport options, and lack of a supportive infrastructure in immediate vicinity.

Why doesn't this council decide to draw a line in the sand, and end the financial horror show, that has plagued Auckland stadia decision making. Make your group the one that history may regale as the one that had the courage, wisdom, and vision, to stop the rot, and give your new RFA CEO the possibility to see that in fact a new stadium in 10,20,or even 30 years time, located near CBD, is the right decision for a city with world class aspirations.

In the meantime, Mt Smart is a safe and relatively comfortable environ to watch the Warriors, or a concert. The stadium is basic, but well supported by fans. A few upgrades would be welcomed, but I would rather watch the Warriors here for another decade as the stadium is right now, than comprehend rattling around Eden Park, or fighting my way to Albany. Perhaps it would even make sense for the Blues rugby franchise to be based here, as I am certain the atmosphere would vastly improve over the sterile experience that Eden park offers.

I enjoy many sports, and watching the All Blacks at a sold out Eden Park, is awesome, and large events like the NRL 9's are great fun, but watching the Blues with even 10,000 fans is not a gratifying experience. I would point out that I actually live within easy walking distance of Eden Park, and I enjoy the local bars and restaurants, so from a selfish perspective I could want the Warriors to play there, but I do not, and I am certain that 99% of Warrior fans agree. Please leave speedway in their spiritual home, which their fans have always supported, and please leave the Warriors in our home, Mt Smart. I ask you this as not only a proud Warriors fan, but as a proud Aucklander who cares. I perhaps have only one vote, but I speak for thousands, if you would care to listen.

It matters greatly to me who is running our city, and how they choose to exercise the elected privilege of doing so. I would therefore ask you, to be upstanding and transparent, courageous and wise, and please reply to me with an indication of how you intend to vote on this matter, as your decision matters to me, and all Aucklanders. Please do the right thing.







# **People Continue to Write Off Champions Prematurely**

YOU used to hear phrases like 'Don't write off a Champion' a lot. We don't seem to hear that sort of comment or come across that sort of mentality so much these days. Maybe it's indicative of society that one poor performance by people in the twilight of their careers often results in people calling for their heads and wanting the younger, faster model to take their place. That's happened the last few weeks as 2 all time greats of world rugby, Richie McCaw and Dan Carter have struggled with their Super rugby form.

People that have been writing off McCaw and Carter so quickly have ignored what history has proven time and time again: that there's a much better chance of an older player bouncing back to somewhere near the world-class level he's performed at previously than there is of a promising young player suddenly taking his game to a level he's never performed at before.

How many times would Manu Vatuvei have been dropped (or thrown in the forwards) if some reactive critics had had their way over the years?

How many years would the Silver Ferns have been without Irene Van Dyk's world-class shooting if some people had had their way calling for her to retire (this went on for about the last 10 years of her career!)?

And how much did Daniel Vettori strengthen the Black Caps' World Cup effort recently after most fans and even the coaching staff appeared to have written off his aging body?

The fact that 2015 is a World Cup year for rugby has undoubtedly accentuated the premature over-reaction to McCaw and Carter's struggles with form. It's even more interesting than usual because many people are prepared to write off BOTH the playing futures of two such great rugby players in the same breath. Comments like "McCaw and Carter are past it" fail to acknowledge the big difference between what the two All Black legends can still offer the Men in Black.

Richie McCaw has proven as recently as last year that he can quickly bounce back from injury or form slumps to somewhere near his best. He provides tremendous leadership value to the All Blacks by just being on the park and oppositions respect and fear him even when he's not at the peak of his powers. He also plays in a position where New Zealand currently has very little world-class depth.

Sam Cane, the next cab off the rank for the All Blacks number 7 jersey has been given a tremendous opportunity to take his time establishing himself at test level. However, to-date when he's been on the park he's never made anything like the impact on matches that McCaw was able to make when he was Canes's age. It's still debatable whether Cane will end up being the long-term successor to McCaw as open-side flanker for the All Blacks.

Dan Carter provides a very unique situation to McCaw's. Carter's had more serious injuries than the All Black Captain and they've not only meant he's played less rugby but also that when he has got back on the park he's appeared a bit gun-shy and not the same combative player that was prepared to constantly take on the line in his prime. Admittedly he hasn't been helped recently by the Crusaders using him in the midfield rather than his preferred position at first-five.

Carter's goal kicking has also been poor recently. This shouldn't surprise people as much as it has done. Compensation injuries naturally impact on the consistency of any swing (look at Tiger Woods post knee surgery for Exhibit A) and injuries will have impacted on DC's ability to practice his goal kicking. They'll also have impacted on his ability to consistently swing through his full range of motion. Neither of these facts are able to give us great faith that Carter will ever again as well as he did in his prime. It still doesn't necessarily mean he won't be able to get back goal kicking at a level good enough to be in the frame for All Black selection though. *Continued on next page...*

In defence of McCaw and Carter's critics, the over-reaction from fans and sections of the media is partly because they were SO great as players in their primes and people came to expect such a consistently high level of performance from them. People need to remember that they're not robots though - and just like people in other professions they are entitled to the odd bad day at the office.

People should also stop making the ridiculous calls I often hear for people to 'retire to protect their legacy'. This fails to recognize that the reason these people became great in the first place was because they thrive on competing and that before they became professionals their sport was their passion - not their profession.

The person that often springs to my mind when people talk of the need to 'protect legacies' is 2005 US Golf Open Champion Michael Campbell. If many New Zealanders had their way he'd have retired from golf years ago as he's struggled to produce performances anything like the one he did at Pinehurst in 2005. Numerous calls have come for his retirement despite the fact that being a professional golfer is often singled out as being the profession that most men would love to be pursuing.

History is littered with Champions that have been written off many times only for them to bounce back and demonstrate the type of traits that made them great in the first place. McCaw and Carter might not BOTH be worthy selections for the All Blacks at World Cup time later this year, but to write them BOTH off in April is something only a fool would do.

'N a week where the ANZAC commemorations gave us all some perspective regarding Sport v 'real' Life I got some additional perspective on the Warriors' loss to the Titans when on the phone to Sir Peter on Sunday morning.

"Pity about the Warriors form eh," I said. His response stopped me in my tracks (as he tends to do!): "John I've been with a woman dying of Cancer for the last hour." The point was lost on me momentarily as I searched for the appropriate comeback... When the penny dropped I had no comeback.

On the topic of people's health though, I hope David Fusitua is fine after he was stretchered off the field v the Titans but ALSO it was interesting that no penalty was given for the tackle that produced Fusitua's injury. I felt that the tackle was effectively competed before the second man came in and it was his involvement which caused the injury. Richie McCaw also left the field at the weekend when he got concussed badly in the second half of the Crusaders match on Saturday night. As Sir Peter reminded me, people's health is much more important than a few rugby or league games.






























## **Another Week in Northland Sport**

# The Filipaina Legend Lives On By John Coffey QSM



THIRTY years on, the Australians have not forgotten Olsen Filipaina, particularly the manner in which he dominated Kangaroos Immortal Wally Lewis in the 1985 trans-Tasman Test series.

We frequently hear Australian commentators claim some strapping young lad is "the biggest five-eighth since Olsen Filipaina" in the knowledge that most of their viewers, even those who were not born three decades ago, are familiar with the legend of the Big O.

Last week an Australian writer contacted me to chat about Olsen's career for an article he was preparing. I'm hoping he also consulted some who knew Olsen better, such as former Kiwis coach Graham Lowe, and was pleased to learn he had arranged a lunch appointment with Olsen himself.

Like many Australians, this writer has spent 30-odd years wondering how Olsen could be so effective for New Zealand, especially when opposed by Lewis, yet seldom reproduced that form in the Winfield Cup during five years at Balmain, one with Easts and two for Norths. In eight seasons Olsen played only first grade 107 matches, scoring 21 tries and 128 goals.

Olsen reserved his best for the Kangaroos. He had made his Test debut in the 1977 World Cup tournament but blazed onto the international scene when the Kiwis toured Australia in 1978. In a side which generally struggled, Olsen was a sensation in the centres as he utilised his special blend of size and speed to keep the Kangaroos on the hop.

There was no doubt he would be a prime target when the overseas transfer regulations were relaxed a couple of years later. While several of his Kiwis team-mates headed for British clubs, Balmain trumpeted the signing of this massive man from Mangere who would thrive in the Sydney competition.

That never happened. But by 1984 Olsen was a seasoned international and Lowe convinced him to switch to stand-off half for the three-Test home series against Great Britain. The move proved a stunning success as the Kiwis whitewashed the Lions and it was no surprise Lowe retained Olsen in the number six jersey for the three 1985 Tests against Australia.

Although Australia escaped with a late converted try and a 26-20 win in the opening Test at Lang Park, Olsen was chosen as Man of the Match after out-playing King Wally on his home turf. That announcement did not go down well with the Brisbane fans, nor with Lewis, who snubbed Olsen after the match.

Olsen was not amused. A week later he was even more rampant in trampling Lewis into the Carlaw Park turf. There was never any doubt he would again be Man of the Match, a reward tempered only when the Kangaroos escaped with a freakish 10-6 victory on the back of a last-minute converted try. Seldom has a team been so dominant yet not emerged victorious.

Lowe then famously took his players into town on the day before the third Test and walked them along Queen Street. The support they received from ordinary Aucklanders shook off their depression at losing the series and contributed greatly to the 18-0 shutout they achieved at Carlaw Park the next day. The crowd gave the Kiwis a magnificent reception and when Olsen went home there was more back-slapping from Sydneysiders for the manner he had served it up to Lewis, their State of Origin nemesis.

I have no doubt that these days Olsen would be a stand-out performer in the NRL. Back in 1980 he was an outsider, a lone Polynesian in what was then still a game played largely by white Australians who had graduated from Sydney's traditional rugby league schools. He was effectively in exile, for there was no television coverage back to New Zealand in those days.

Frank Stanton fashioned an outstanding coaching record for various Sydney clubs and the Kangaroos. He was in charge of Balmain and Norths while Olsen was there, and it is unlikely his confrontational style would have put them on the same wavelength. Stanton did not recruit Olsen for either club and never got the best out of him.

Olsen played 29 Tests from 1977 to 1986, scoring 108 points from six tries and 44 goals. In all, he made 50 appearances for the Kiwis for 15 tries, 71 goals, 190 points. He was vice-captain on the 1985 tour to Britain and France, leading the Kiwis in the second British Test when Mark Graham was injured. Olsen later captained his local Ryde Eastwood club to victory in the inaugural Sydney Metropolitan Cup second division competition.

He has been gone from the footy fields for a quarter of a century. Gone, but never forgotten.
