Simon was in the Mad Butcher Lounge after we went down on Saturday night to Cronulla, and he appealed for the fans in the capital to get out and support the team.

"All I can say is that we are disappointed, but the effort was there, it was certainly better than the last two weeks when we let the fans down.

"Wellington is a special night for us and we will be determined to put on a good show and do everything we can to get back on the winning horse, because we want to be there in September."

Barnstorming prop Ben Matulino, who played in the second row for the injured Bodene Thompson on Saturday, can't wait to get home to the capital.

He'll be one of the most interested men there when the curtain-raiser is played, because it is the Wellington Rugby League's grand final between his old club, Te Aroha Eels and Wainuiomata.

"When we go away to play you can see plenty of hotels, but Wellington is really special because I get to go home and stay with Mum," Ben said.

"I've got my ticket order in because I've got 80 friends and family coming to watch, so I have to be right on top of my game because I don't want to let anyone down.

"It's really important that Wellington gets behind us. We are going to need massive public support and the crowd to get into it, to really participate, because believe me you know when the crowd is vocal and right behind you, and when it isn't."

Charlie Gubb's On Fire




Now Wellington can get behind their own at Westpac Stadium, and Charlie is looking forward to showing what the boy who played his club league for University Hunters can do on home soil.



Simon Mannering The Vodafone Warriors & Kiwis Captain

LONG WITH most Australian Rugby League people, I am a big fan of Kiwis and Warriors captain, Simon Mannering. On the field he more than does his job, both as captain and in the tough work in the tight play. Off the field, he is a fine example for New Zealanders of all ages and a proud father. Looking at the official NRL website last Sunday, it showed that in his 18 games in 2015, Simon had made 880 tackles which is the most for any Warriors player this year. The figures for his running metres and hit ups also place him near the top of these lists.

Simon is now in his 11th season of first grade football and in that time has more than held his own with every opponent. His 230 games in the top grade and 53 tries, show just what a major role he has played for the Warriors in these 11 seasons. He has averaged more than 20 matches a season and this durability is priceless in the week to week grind of the NRL competition. His on-field work is very high and just as important, he is respected and liked by the referees. During his 120 or so games as Warriors captain, he has always treated the whistle blowers with dignity, patience and politeness. This ensures Simon and the Warriors are treated in the same manner, although no referee will please all players and fans. His recent contract extension will see him remain with the Warriors until the end of the 2018 season and barring injury, he will be close to the magic 300 first grade game mark with more than half of these as a captain.

What he gives to the Warriors, Simon also brings to the New Zealand side. His 40 Tests (5 tries) have given him 20 wins and 20 defeats, but the winning percentage since he has been captain from 11 October 2013, is 82, or nine victories from 11 matches. This includes New Zealand's last five Test matches, three against Australia and one each with England and Samoa. As captain of his country, Simon's relationship with international referees is just as strong as it is with the NRL men. During his 11 Tests as captain, New Zealand have played at 10 different venues. These are Wellington's Westpac stadium, Dunedin and Whangarei in New Zealand, twice at Suncorp in Brisbane and Allianz stadium in Sydney, plus Wembley, Old Trafford, Leeds and Warrington in England, as well as Avignon in the south of France. Englishman Phil Bentham, now 43, has controlled four of these Tests, while his countryman, Richard Silverwood has handled two of them.. Australian Ben Cummins has refereed two Tests and his countrymen, Gerard Sutton, Henry Perenara and Shane Hayne, the remaining three. As usual when Simon is the captain, there were no problems during these Tests.

During his career, the Napier-born New Zealander has played Test football as a second rower (21 Tests), lock (11 Tests) and centre (7 Tests). He came off the bench is his other Test. This versatility is another positive that Simon brings to his teams.

The Warriors were devastated by Shaun Johnson's season ending ankle injury and everyone is very aware that it will be hard to finish in the top eight. But with Simon leading the way, the right man is in place to get this job done. Simon won't give up and his team-mates will be right behind him. From now until the season's end, every one of the remaining five regular season matches will be vital. Three of these games are across the Tasman, with the last two being at ANZ Stadium in Sydney. Simon will probably celebrate is 29th birthday in Sydney, on Friday 28 August, as the Warriors prepare for the clash with the unpredictable Wests Tigers on Sunday 30 August. Let's hope he celebrates with a win.
